	Have you review playing guidance and make suitable adaptation to your approach to practice and matches?	Yes club will adhere to government and ECB advice.
	Have you reviewed supervision ratios and adapt group sizes for supervised children's activities accordingly? Have you ensured safeguarding procedures are being followed, even under COVID restrictions?	Yes club will adhere to government and ECB advice.

	An assessment of user numbers, space capacities, venue circulation and layout planning to maintain social distancing.	1 way system to enter building for toilets.
	A plan for where parents and players will sit whilst watching cricket activities.	Parents will be advised to sit in a socially distanced manner.
	Signage and communication so that all participants and visitors (including spectators) are aware of the control measures in place and how to act appropriately to minimise the risk of transmission of COVID-19.	Signage provided and displayed at regular intervals.
	Staff and volunteer training to support the implementation of the plan, with suitable training records.	Briefing to be completed before any activity commences.
<b>Buildings</b>		
	Assess ventilation in your building (natural and mechanical) and take appropriate measures to maximise ventilation and minimise risk of transmission.	Windows and doors open to allow circulation of air through building.
	Assess the maximum occupancy of your rooms in order to ensure Social Distancing can be maintained, and establish a suitable circulation system / one-way system. Use signage and floor markings to communicate this.	Operate a 1 in 1 out queuing system into the building.
	Assess the arrangement of seating areas to maintain social distancing and minimise the risk of transmission.	Seating will be provided out doors for players in a socially distanced manner.
	Consider your wet weather plans and describe what actions you will take to maintain social distancing in wet weather.	Players advised to sit in cars until rain stops and the game can recommence.

	Have you ensured your social and hospitality areas will remain closed?	N/A
<b>Hygiene and Cleaning</b>		
	Develop an appropriate cleaning plan	Building deep cleaned, regular cleaning of toilet facilities.
	Materials, PPE and training that you have provided to your staff for effective cleaning.	Gloves masks and anti bacterial cleaner provided.
	Provision of hand washing facilities with warm water, soap, disposable towels and bin.	Hand washing facilities provided in both toilet facilities with soap water anti bac spray and hand towels.
	Provision of suitable hand sanitiser in locations around the facility to maintain frequent hand sanitisation.	Sanitiser will be provided on entry to ground as well as at multiple points on the ground.
	Provision of suitable wipes and hand sanitiser on the field for Hygiene Breaks.	Wipes available.

<b>Preparing Your Buildings</b>		
	Consider the risk of Legionnaire’s disease and carry out necessary work to make your water supply safe for users. Refer to the specific guidance in the document above.	Sought advice from plumber.
	Check that routine maintenance has not been missed and certification is up to date (e.g. Gas safety, Electrical Safety and Portable Appliance Testing, Fire Safety, Lifts and Heating – Ventilation and Air Conditioning).	N/A
	Check that your ground is ready and safe to play. Look at what work is required and how this can be done safely at a social distance.	Ground work underway – groundsman following govt guidelines
<b>What are the hazards?</b>	Vital first aid equipment is not available when needed. First aiders do not have adequate PPE to carry out first aid when required.

	Check that your first aid kits are stocked and accessible during all activity.	First aid kits checked and placed outside clubhouse
	What steps have you taken to improve your first aiders’ understanding of first aid provision under COVID?	Yes additional ppe provided plus signage of first aiders – outside the clubhouse
	If you have an AED then check that it is in working order, service is up to date and that it is available during all activity.	N/A
